# **Elsa's Frozen Slime**

#### **Ingredients:**

- 5 oz clear glue
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1 tbsp saline solution
- Blue colorant (you can also use food coloring, paint or pigment)
- Teal/Blue glitter

#### Other Mix-Ins to Add

- Blue sequins
- Faux snow (confetti)
- Beads
- Clear and Blue Beads
- 'Diamond' beads
- Snowflake charms

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Combine glue and water in a medium size bowl. Mix until glue breaks up and incorporates into the water.
- 2. Add a few drops of blue colorant, mixing and adding more drops until you achieve your desired shade of blue.
- 3. Add glitter and stir to mix well.
- 4. Add the remainder of your mix-ins (snow, beads, snowflakes, sequins, etc...) and stir to mix well.
- 5. Stir in baking soda.
- 6. Add saline solution and stir well to combine.

Stir until the slime begins to form

and pull away from the sides of the container.

7. Knead the slime. It will be very sticky at first but keep kneading and it will get less sticky.



8. and gently press the cookies out.
